After separating from the Air Force, Lamb returned to the Kansas City area and engaged in various information technology consulting endeavors.

Lamb left the private sector as the chief information officer of a local tech company in



2003, joining the FBI in 2004. While in the FBI, he has served in field offices in

Springfield, Illinois, San Antonio, Texas, and Kansas City, Missouri.

Lamb worked public corruption cases in Springfield before transitioning to cyber matters, the area in which he now works exclusively. His cyber investigations have included both criminal and national security matters.

Lamb earned a Master's degree in Psychology and a Ph.D. in Information Technology/Information Assurance, both from Capella University.
